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TAKE THE LEAP INTO KINDERGARTEN

This is a basic checklist that can be used as a guide only. This list is based on OT and Speech Pathology goals. Remember you know your child best so if you are concerned about their development, please give us a call to make an appointment.

Social Skills

- Can sit and attend during group time for 5-8 minutes
- □ Shows interest in letters and numbers
- □ Can share & negotiate rules with peers
- **C**an say their full name
- □ Can play with toys independently, with peers and with adults

Fine Motor

- Can draw a circle, square, plus sign and rectangle, working towards diagonal lines & triangles by 5 years 3 months.
- Can pick up and manipulate items within the hand
- Holds a pencil using a 3 or 4 fingers (resembling an adult's grasp)
- □ Has a hand dominance
- Uses scissors to cut on lines and around basic shapes
- □ Attempts to draw pictures of specific items (with reasonable resemblance)
- Can draw a person with resemblance and most features (aiming for also including a body)
- Can thread medium beads onto a string with ease
- Colours between the lines, and changing colours for different sections (not perfect colouring)
- □ Is attempting to write name

Gross Motor

- Can make an X on chest with arms
- Can climb confidently on play equipment
- Balances on 1 foot for 10 seconds

Receptive Language

- Understand place & time related words (e.g. first, before, after, now, next, last, above, below, middle)
- Understand difference between day and night
- Beginning to understand comparatives (e.g. "this elephant is big, and this elephant is even bigger")
- □ Starting to understand "when" questions
- Following 3 part instructions (routine based)

Expressive Language

- Uses well formed sentences to be understood by most people (even strangers)
- Participating in longer conversations
- Uses pronouns such as (his, her)
- □ Uses joining words (if, so, but)
- Combines five to eight words in a sentence
- Can say days of the week in sequence
- Identify the odd one out from a group of three items (apple, banana, foot)
- Attempts to tell a long story in sequence, but may get lost and forget the main idea.
- □ Uses most sounds correctly but may have difficulty with S, R, L & TH

Self Care

- Can open their own lunchbox and packets
- Can put on and take off their jumpers and jackets
- Can toilet independently / has provisions in place that the school is aware of.
